LCC WELCOMES ALL!

Trying something new can be intimidating - especially when that thing is a week at camp away from your family. Knowing this and knowing that we typically see over 200 first-year campers at Kirchenwald and Nawakwa each summer, establishing a welcoming community is a top priority. "My son had a wonderful first week of camp. I couldn't have asked for more. Thanks to the staff for showing him God's love," said one camper mom.

Through the Total Inclusion initiative, the Lutheran Camping Corporation has explicitly committed itself to welcoming persons of all ages, genders, races, nationalities, creeds, sexualities, gender identities, and abilities, however possible. We strive for inclusivity so that all might know God's wondrous love.



"My child has autism," one camper parent shared. "I think I was just as nervous as he was about camp. He had never really been away from home before. I was fully expecting to get a call to come pick him up on the first night. But he had such a good week that it was hard to get him to leave on Saturday morning. He talked the whole way home about the friends he made and how much he learned."

While the staff at camp are trained on our organizational values, the returning campers are just as important in building a culture of hospitality. "One of my favorite things about camp is meeting new people," one camper wrote in her survey. "I remember what it was like to be new at camp so I want to make other new kids feel happy when they're here."

Some first-year campers have such a good time, they come back again later in the summer. "My son loved all three weeks and had amazing experiences," wrote a camper mom. "He definitely had the spiritual growth I was looking for. I'm so glad I found your camp. We look forward to next summer!"

"AND WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?"

This question, posed to Jesus, is one our world still wrestles with today. Jesus responds by sharing a story about a man who receives care from an unlikely ally. At camp we are reminded that loving your neighbor is a call to action and that, much like our Bible study theme of 'Boundless' in 2022, there can be no limits placed on it.

Campers practice neighborly love while living in community with one another for a week. But the values we live by in camp are not confined to the geography of our properties. Christ's messages are for all people and for all times. Appropriately, a week at Kirchenwald and Nawakwa gives us time and space to consider our contributions to the world at large.

THE CHURCH IS THE WHOLE BODY OF CHRIST

The Lutheran Camping Corporation has a long history of working with the ELCA to employ International Counselors. When COVID put a pause to that program last summer and left us uncertain about what to expect moving forward, Pastor Drahus Oslik, Vice Chair of the board of directors for the Lutheran Camping Corporation, and former international counselor from Slovakia, offered to help ensure we could continue the rich cultural diversity that comes with having international counselors on a summer staff. On Nawakwa's Summer 2022 staff, we welcomed Simi Secanska, Petra Sochorova, and Filip Berky from Slovakia and Kasper Sorensen from Denmark. Kirchenwald welcomed Miriam Gregova from Slovakia and Emmanuel Mchomvu from Tanzania. Emmanuel, who spent his first summer at camp in 2010, then a student, returned for another summer in 2022, this time as a Pastor. Their presence with us had a profound impact on our ministry, from learning worship songs in Slovak and Swahili to Danish cuisine. Campers enjoyed asking questions and learning about the counselors' home countries and the wide world beyond Pennsylvania. The Reverend Beth Martini, pastor in the Lower Susquehanna Synod, and parent of a Kirchenwald camper, shared that having an international counselor made a lasting impression on her daughter. She expressed that "the Church is not just our individual congregations but the whole body of Christ across all times and places. Camp brings back into focus the things that are essential – relationships with God and one another. The experience of an international counselor

deepens our understanding of the Church and helps us grow together as children of God." She further noted that having international counselors from the Konde Diocese, for example, with whom our synod has a long-standing relationship, helps our youngest disciples form connections and relationships across the globe.

As the international counselors reflected on their summer, it was clear that the ministry of the Lutheran Camping Corporation had a profound impact on them as well. Each commented on how welcome they were made to feel, by the rest of the summer staff, by the campers, and by families. They also recognized the importance of stepping out of their comfort zone and trying new experiences and how leadership opportunities were significant to their personal growth. They built relationships with staff members, some of which will be lifelong, no doubt. Simi Secanska, who spent her third summer on Nawakwa's staff this summer, and is currently studying at Seminary in Slovakia said, "I never leave camp the same (as) when I arrived. God's love travels all around the world. If one only stays within their own community, they cannot experience the boundless love of God in other parts of the world. "

Thanks be to God for the gift of the international counselors and for the ministry of the Lutheran Camping Corporation in building up leaders, not just in Central Pennsylvania, but throughout the world!

Through another season of growing, the Nawakwa garden grew and donated over 2,000 pounds of produce to the food relief efforts in Adams County. Campers helped to tend and harvest the land, gaining an appreciation for God's creation and for hunger justice efforts.

At Kirchenwald, campers donated supplies and assembled kits to welcome refugee families to a new life in Central Pennsylvania. With over 140 kits packaged and given to Church World Services, many individuals and families will receive a token of love that represents God's love during a significant time of transition in their lives.

We are grateful for the efforts of our campers this summer and rejoice that the lessons of Jesus are being lived out at camp every day.

THE WITTEL FARM GROWING PROJECT 2022

"The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season. You open your hand, satisfying the desire of every living thing." Psalm 145

With the support of over 300 volunteers this summer, over 10,000 pounds of fresh vegetables were harvested and shared with our food insecure neighbors in our seventh growing season! This season's harvest also included sugar snap peas, potatoes, kale, peppers, tomatoes, cantaloupe, watermelon, zucchini, green beans, cucumbers, pumpkins, and winter squash.



Elderberries were harvested for the first time this year and jamming, preserving, and salsa-making experiences are anticipated in future seasons! Harvesting will continue through October.

This summer, persistent heat and inconsistent rainfall presented

challenging conditions for vegetable production. Controlling weeds was also challenging. Growing vegetables chemically free, with a reduced tillage system, and utilizing on-site produced compost produced help maintain soil health.

A 2021 Central PA Food Bank grant of \$50,000 allowed for the installation of a large walk-in cooler in the barn, which kept vegetables fresh, and created harvest and distribution flexibility.

Two youth support staff worked tirelessly supporting volunteers, planting, tending, harvesting, and delivering produce. Their service was truly a blessing!

In partnership with Zest Cooking School and Chef Diana Smedley, the Wittel Farm was featured in an August cooking class! She created several delicious recipes using our melons, tomatoes, and peppers. This was the first of, hopefully, many future opportunities to partner in the farm-to-table cooking movement. Diana is a professional chef and the founder of Lancaster Local Provisions, with her husband Gabriel.



The Wittel Farm provides a unique experience as a place of service learning that involves food sharing, active discipleship, and ecological principles of creation care. The WFGP offers programming for school groups and colleges, for congregations, and others.

THE IRA ROLLOVER - A GREAT TAX-WISE GIFT TO SUPPORT THE LUTHERAN CAMPING CORPORATION

If you or a family member are 71½ or older and have an IRA, the IRA Rollover is a great option to support The Lutheran Camping Corporation. It can also remove the tax liability for donors age 72 and older who are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) that would otherwise be taxable.

The specifics for this option are summarize below. Please consult your financial advisor to arrange your RMD Rollover.

Required Minimum Distributions

Persons holding IRA accounts and are age 59½ may begin withdrawing money from their account without penalty. These withdrawals are taxable to the account holder. Additionally, account holders who are 72 years of age and older are required to withdraw a minimum distribution annually from their account. Those distributions are taxable to the account holder.

The Charitable IRA Rollover Option

In December 2015, the "Path Act" made permanent the law allowing donors 70½ and older to withdraw up to \$100,000 each year from the total of all their IRA accounts tax-free if they designate the distribution directly to a charitable cause(s). Any distribution to charity (up to \$100,000) counts towards the donor's required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA even though the charity, and not the donor, is the recipient.

While a 2019 bill increased the age to 72 at which an IRA account holder is required to take their RMD, it still allows for charitable gift rollover designation beginning at the age of $70\frac{1}{2}$.

The account holder must designate their Rollover to the charity and the distribution must be made directly to the charity, not the account holder. In this case, the account holder will have no tax liability for the distribution but will receive no tax deduction for the distribution.

THE WITTEL FARM AWARDED BIG DREAM GRANT

The Wittel Farm received an ELCA World Hunger Big Dream Grant this year! \$98,000 was granted to install a pavilion classroom with kitchen and bathroom facilities. It will be a space where volunteers and other guests gather to learn about and help alleviate food insecurity. It will be a place to host workshops about preparing and preserving fruits and vegetables, ecotheology, and faith-rooted farming. It will be a place where Christian fellowship is experienced, a place for worship, and a place of retreat experiences for faith communities.

Construction begins later this fall. The pavilion will be ready for use by spring 2023. Final construction cost will be \$173,133 which means you can join this exciting project by making a financial donation designated to WFGP Pavilion Project.

We are very grateful to ELCA World Hunger for its generous support and for making this project possible.
