Her counselor noticed the expression on her face and sat down next to her to check in. Isabelle confessed that she was feeling a little sad to be at camp without Maggie and worried that she wouldn't make any friends that week. As she said this, one of the boys in her group, Caleb, walked past the table and overheard her comment. Without missing a beat, he announced, "We'll be your friend, right guys?" He

called over some of the other kids in the group and they rearranged their seats so they could sit next to Isabelle for lunch.

Later that evening the group gathered down by the stream for Bible Study. The theme for the day was "Who is Jesus?" with an emphasis on the relationships that Jesus forms and friendships that are made. When asked for examples of friendships grounded in the love of Christ, Isabelle had only to think back a few hours to share her story from lunch.

## A Cause for Celebration... ...Seeding the Future Mortgage Fully Retired!

## It is now wonderful to announce the news that the mortgage has been fully retired.

In 2007, after much prayer and discussion, the LCC Board of Directors made the faithful and courageous decision to spend $\$ 1.588$ million to expand the Nawakwa ministry site by purchasing 221 acres of land adjacent to the camp. To do so, a 25 year mortgage was secured from the Mission investment Fund of the ELCA. This decision came with excitement and apprehension. The excitement came from knowing the importance of expanding Nawakwa and the many opportunities this would create. The apprehension came from not knowing what the response would be from the many people who care about Nawakwa and the LCC's ministry, and if they would generously come forward to pay for the land so that financial resources for ministry operations would not be adversely impacted.

Yes, in just 16 years the mortgage has been fully paid, off thereby saving considerable money on interest!

Yes, this calls for celebration. Let's celebrate the generosity of everyone who made donations to this very good cause, everyone who gave their time and talent in the fundraising campaigns, everyone who prayed for the success of this venture, and to God who guides and inspires LCC ministries. Working with the ELCA, GEC Camp USA and Interexchange, LCC employed 11 International Counselors between Kirchenwald and Nawakwa this past summer. Pastor Drahus Oslik, Vice Chair of the Board of Directors and a former international counselor at Nawakwa, played an important role coordinating the recruiting process and arranging host families for each international counselor.

Serving at Nawakwa were Vinicius Pinto from Brazil, Matej Kolik and Simi Secanska from Slovakia, Roberto Valverde from Mexico, Anita Ogbozor from Ireland, Laura Rodriguez, Mellisa Hernandez Galteros and Paula Carolina Ruiz Guiot from Columbia, Merelin Guerrero from Ecuador, and Garazi Arenaza from Spain. This is the most international staff ever employed at Nawakwa.

Pastor Emmanuel Mchomvu from the Kondi Diocese in Tanzania
returned to Kirchenwald for his third summer.

Having international staff at camp was a positive experience for staff and campers alike. Numerous lifelong friendships developed among the staff members. Campers enjoyed learning about the international counselors' countries, some of their language, and especially enjoyed when the menu included food from those countries. Likewise, the international staff were excited to experience American culture. International staff members were part of a worship team. They worked with their worship teammates incorporating aspects of their culture, including language and songs, into the camp worship experience, creating a lasting impression for the campers and the entire camp staff.

Campers returning for a second week or a Family Camp week excitedly greeted the international counselors with smiles and hugs. Campers and their parents shared how much they enjoyed and appreciated the diversity which international counselors added to the camp experience.

Thanks be to God for the gift of the international staff and for the ministry of camp that we all shared this past summer. Lutheran Camping Corporation is nurturing the faith of future church leaders here and throughout the world.


## The Wittel Farm Growing Project Abundance \& Gratitude!

Abundance. This is the best word to describe the Wittel Farm Growing Project in 2023. By the numbers, it was clearly a season of abundance. From April through August, we saw close to 500 volunteers visit the farm and serve our neighbors by planting, growing, and sharing fresh vegetables. Over 90 campers came to the Wittel Farm from Kirchenwald as part of their outdoor ministry experience, many coming to the farm for the first time.

From June through September, the farm produced over 26,000 pounds of vegetables, our eighth growing season and second most productive season on record. We grew 5 types of tomatoes, 3 types of peppers, watermelon, cantaloupe, zucchini, cucumbers, sweet corn, green beans, two types of potatoes, lettuce, kale, sugar snap peas, Swiss chard, pumpkins, spaghetti squash, and sunflowers. We harvested elderberries and plums from our fruit trees. We tried some new things and, despite early summer drought conditions, the farm thrived. We saw over a dozen different song birds, many types of insects, and lots of pollinating bees and butterflies, all indicators that the farm is a healthy ecosystem.

We partnered with nine food distribution partners, including four new ones: Spanish American Civic Association, Ebenezer Baptist Church, Bethel African Methodist Episcopal Church, and Lebanon County Christian Ministries. We served thousands of people throughout Lancaster and Lebanon counties. Central PA Food bank services 27 counties and we sent about 10,000 pounds of food to them.

We continue to learn how to responsibly care for the land, grow healthy food, and create community committed to agriculture as a faithful part of outdoor ministry.

Next year, we will expand our educational experiences for groups and congregations and invite you to find ways to be part of the abundance and experience God's love as shared by the wonderful ministry of the Wittel Farm.

With so much Abundance, the fruit that is produced in me is Gratitude.

Thanks to the congregations that supported our ministry this year with volunteers: Epiphany, Harrisburg; Christ, Elizabethtown; Christ UCC, Elizabethtown; St. Peter's, Mechanicsburg; St. Mark's, Harrisburg. Lancaster County Confirmation Camp also participated again this season. Congregation Shaarai Shomayim, the reformed Jewish synagogue in Lancaster, planted spaghetti squash in June as part of Shavuot, the first fruits harvest festival. They
returned in late September to harvest that squash as part of Sukkot, the end of the harvest season. The Elizabethtown Ward of the Latter day Saints comes out several times during the season to harvest together. The Elizabethtown Rotary Club is an annual partner, coming with enthusiasm to work every year.

The farm does not operate without amazing, dedicated volunteer staff. Thank you, Christ Eurich, Tim Ainsley, Richard Marshall, and the Smoker family who come every week and do difficult chores to keep the farm maintained, beautiful, and productive. Thanks to our two student summer staff, Will Stover and Henry Hammer, for their commitment to the Growing Project's success.

Thanks to God the creator and the beauty of the earth for giving us this place, these people, and the ability to grow and share together.

Thanks to all those who generously give donations supporting this wonderful ministry. WFGP accomplishes all this good work using only the financial gifts given specifically to this purpose. These donations allow us to buy seeds and plants, equipment and supplies, diesel fuel for the tractor, and all the resources needed for this very good cause. ## The IRA Rollover - A Great Tax-wise Gift to Support The Lutheran Camping Corporation

If you or a family member are $701 / 2$ or older and have an IRA, the IRA Rollover is a great option to support The Lutheran Camping Corporation. It can also remove the tax liability for donors age 73 and older who are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) that would otherwise be taxable.
The specifics for this option are summarized below. Please consult your financial advisor to arrange your RMD Rollover.

## Required Minimum Distributions

Persons holding IRA accounts and are aged $591 / 2$ may begin withdrawing money from their account without penalty. These withdrawals are taxable to the account holder. Additionally, account holders who are 73 years of age and older are required to withdraw a minimum distribution annually from their account (RMD). Those distributions are taxable to the account holder.

## The Charitable IRA Rollover Option

In December 2015, the "Path Act" made permanent the law allowing donors $701 / 2$ and older to withdraw up to $\$ 100,000$ each year from the total of all their IRA accounts tax-free if they designate the distribution directly to a charitable cause(s). Any distribution to charity (up to $\$ 100,000$ ) counts towards the donor's required minimum distribution (RMD) from their IRA even though the charity, and not the donor, is the recipient.

A recent bill increased the age to 73 for those born between 1951 and 1959 and to 75 for those born after 1960, at which an IRA account holder is required to take their RMD, but it still allows for charitable gift rollover designation beginning at the age of $701 / 2$.
The account holder must designate their Rollover to the charity and the distribution must be made directly to the charity, not the account holder. In this case, the account holder will have no tax liability for the distribution but will receive no tax deduction for the distribution.
What a great way to make a great gift with great tax savings!
