We strive to make camp a place where all people are welcome and have a chance to grow into the best versions of themselves.

He grew in confidence and personally so much that multiple people have commented on how he blossomed this summer."

"My 9-year-old has high functioning autism and has trouble making friends. He told me it was the best camp. He told me all the people he talked to and their names. He was so excited to make friends for the first time." Safety is a top priority at camp.

"They talked non-stop on the way home about their week. It was amazing to know they had such a great time in a place where they feel safe and loved."

"From the moment we met her counselor, you could feel the love and care our daughter would have for the week."

At its core, camp is a ministry for learning and sharing God's love in the world.

CAMP FOR EVERY BRAIN

The Lutheran Camping Corporation wants everyone to experience camp, including those who are neurodivergent. Neurodivergent is a term to describe people whose brains work differently. This includes ADHD, autism, anxiety, sensory processing, and learning differences. Both Kirchenwald and Nawakwa had summer campers who needed extra resources to enjoy camp. Kirchenwald has pop bracelets and fidget spinners available for campers to use, and they make sure to have printed schedules available for those campers who are visual learners. Nawakwa also provides ear plugs for campers who are overstimulated with noise. This summer, the camps have seen campers who are neurodivergent have a great connection with their cabin group, lead song grace, and ask questions



during Bible study. A handful of campers at Nawakwa this summer were overstimulated in the dining hall with all the noise and movement during songs. They were able to step onto the porch outside, grab some earplugs, and even enjoyed some of the dancing with us on the porch! We pray a week at camp blurs, if not erases, the space between "normal" and neurodivergent so it is just God's people. Everyone should have the opportunity to experience and participate in God's community at camp.

ANNUAL QUILT & CRAFT AUCTION



LIVING OUT FAITH THROUGH SERVICE

There are numerous references in the Bible to service and volunteering of time and talents. Paul advises to the church in Galatia that we ought to use our freedom to serve one another humbly. And Jesus teaches that loving our neighbor is a form of loving God. At camp, we both coach our campers to be service-minded and are blessed to be the recipient of the service of others.

Once again, the Lebanon Lutheran Mission Team committed a week at Kirchenwald doing a variety of projects from the ecological (removing invasive plants) to skilled labor (roof work, electrical systems, and retaining walls) to beautification and cleaning. Their generosity helps to advance the ministry of summer camp and beyond. Similarly, volunteers from Evangelical Lutheran Church in Waynesboro made the trip to Nawakwa - renovating cabins in lower camp to make them more welcoming and functional by painting, cleaning, and renovating the bathrooms. Opportunities like these will continue for groups at all LCC locations, moving forward.

Three congregations also joined in on service work through the Diaconos program (one as far away as Wisconsin!). With an array of sites and organizations to help, these youth groups and their advisors touched the lives of horse riders with special needs in therapeutic riding lessons, individuals with health needs through the medical clinic in Harrisburg, residents of retirement communities by leading worships and playing games, and single mothers with housing insecurities by preparing a week's worth of meals.

We are grateful for the giving spirit of all those who contribute to the camp community, and we celebrate the opportunity to lift up service and generosity as a core value for our campers and their families.



HARVESTING HOPE - WITTEL FARM GROWING PROJECT CELEBRATES 10 YEARS

The Wittel Farm Growing Project is celebrating 10 years of planting, growing, and sharing fresh vegetables with our neighbors. Just as important as the food we share is the connection we experience with God the Creator and the good creation that sustains us. This land, entrusted to the Lutheran Camping Corporation and the Lower Susquehanna Synod, answers God's call to feed the hungry and care for creation.

As an ecological and educational farm, Wittel Farm welcomes hundreds of volunteers and learners each year—from campers at Kirchenwald to youth groups from as far away as Wisconsin. In 2025 alone, more than 320 volunteers, including 120 youth, joined us for hands-on service and learning.

This summer we also increased biodiversity, adding flowers to attract pollinators and planting our most diverse crop ever—over 25 different vegetables. Despite challenging weather, we began harvesting in late May and will continue through October, donating most of our produce to local food networks in Lancaster and Lebanon Counties.

Please join us on the farm for spiritual retreats, ecological learning, and volunteer opportunities that feed our neighbors and care for God's creation.
